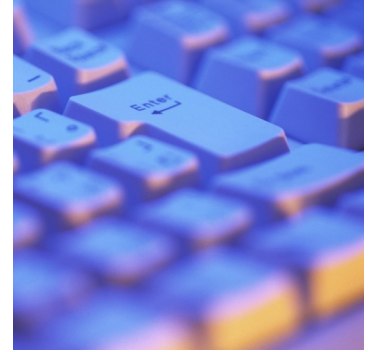

January’s program gave us great information on those ‘outside’ property issues that our churches are faced with. We asked companies to help us ‘shop’ for good vendors.

Debra Ramirez and Harry Grass represented **Gordon Sign**—a company that has served Denver for 106 years. They recommended questioning the following when shopping for a sign:

- Is it a good company? Look for name-brand materials, quality controls, total years’ experience, engineering capability, orientation to

professionalism journeyman workers.

- How do you select a company? Look for longevity, references; written warranty proper insurance, UL/ NEC compliance
- What to be wary of? Be cautious of demand for full payment up front, no documentation of proper insurance, lack of written warranty, can’t verify experience

Jim Fagans owns **Jim Fagan’s Landscaping**. He gave us a recommended vendor list for soil testing, fertilizer & ice melt supplier, tree & shrub pruning, lawn maintenance and snow removal. He specifically addressed:

- Landscape site maintenance

- Formal lawn—native seed
- Trees and shrubs
- Shrub and flower beds
- Snow plowing—lot and walkways
